ADHD Diagnosis and Treatment

What is the problem (C2)?

ADHD is one of the most common neurodevelopmental disorders of childhood. It is usually first diagnosed in childhood and often lasts into adulthood. There is no single test to diagnose ADHD and many other problems, like anxiety, depression, sleep problems, and certain types of learning



disabilities, can have similar symptoms. In most cases, ADHD is best treated with a combination of behavior therapy and medication. New data released by the CDC shows that the number of reproductive-age women in the United States who receive prescription medications for ADHD jumped more than 300% from 2003 to 2015. The most significant increase in ADHD prescriptions occurred among women aged 25 – 29 years (700% increase). Physicians may not be aware of the new ADHD findings and thus, may not be providing optimal care of these patients.
