What is the problem (C2)?

Smoking continues to be the leading cause of preventable disease and death in the United States and costs the United States billions of dollars each year. 15.5% of all adults were current cigarette smokers in 2016, and each day, more than 3,200 people under 18 years old smoke their first cigarette. A recent study in men showed that long-term smoking cessation had a protective effect against dementia risk. Quitting smoking greatly reduces the risk of developing smoking-related diseases. There are helpful treatments and resources for quitting, and it is very important for primary health-care providers to assess tobacco use among their adult and adolescent patients, and counsel users to help them quit.
