What is the problem?

More than 4.2 million Americans age 40 and older are either legally blind or with low vision. As the population of older people continues to accelerate, the number of people experiencing vision loss will increase. The leading causes of these vision problems include age-related macular degeneration, cataracts, diabetic retinopathy, and glaucoma. In addition, 2-3% of primary care visits are for eye complaints. It is crucial for primary care physicians to identify and treat common eye problems they may encounter and know when to refer them to a specialist.
